

# RFSSL CRIME REPORT (JUNE, 2024.)



## **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:**

By using a sample size of 12 counties that were sampled randomly in preparation, analysis and coming up with the crime trends, in the period under review, a total of **4,113** crime related incidents were reported. This is a slight drop in criminal activities in comparison to the previous period where a total of **4,179** crime related incidents were reported while translates to a **1.58%** drop in crime rate in the period under review.

Four out of the twelve counties that were sampled for this report recorded a decline in crime trends in the period under review in comparison to the previous month. These area: Nairobi County (**1.43%** drop.), Kisumu County (**6.79%** drop.), Uasin Gishu County (**15.93%** drop.) and Mombasa County (**7.60%** drop.)

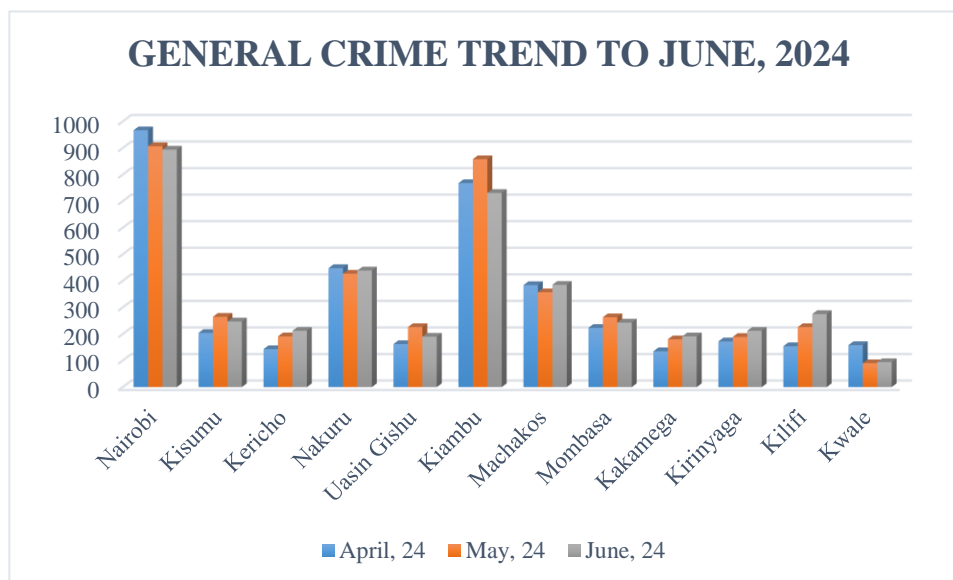
Despite the Nairobi county recording a **1.43%** drop in crime rate in the period under review, this is the county that recorded the highest number of crimes at **894** incidents with a majority of the incidents being recorded in the Eastlands Division of Starehe where a total of **138** crime related cases were reported accounting for **15.44%** of the total number of incidents recorded within the county. In terms of crime prevalence, the Nairobi county was closely followed by the Kiambu county which recorded a total of **731** cases.

For the second month in a row within the sampled counties, Kilifi County recorded the highest percentage rise in crime at **21.68%** in the period under review. This is however a drop by almost half compared to the previous review period whereby the county recorded a **46.75%** rise in crime rate.

**QUARTER 2 OF 2024 CRIME TREND ANALYSIS:**

As at the end of quarter two of 2024, a total of **12,210** criminal cases were reported to the various law enforcement agencies within the sample population. This is a very minimal increase in criminal activities compared to the quarter one of 2024 statistics whereby a total of **12,205** criminal cases signifying a **0.04%** increase in crime rate between the two quarters to the half year 2024. This would therefore mean that the crime rate has remain constant during this period.

On the other hand, in a comparative analysis done for the crime trends in quarter 2 of 2023 and quarter 2 of 2024, **6.89%** increase in crime rate was noted with a total of **11,423** crime related incidents recorded in the quarter 2 of 2023 compared to **12,210** cases recorded in quarter 2 of 2024 within the sample population.

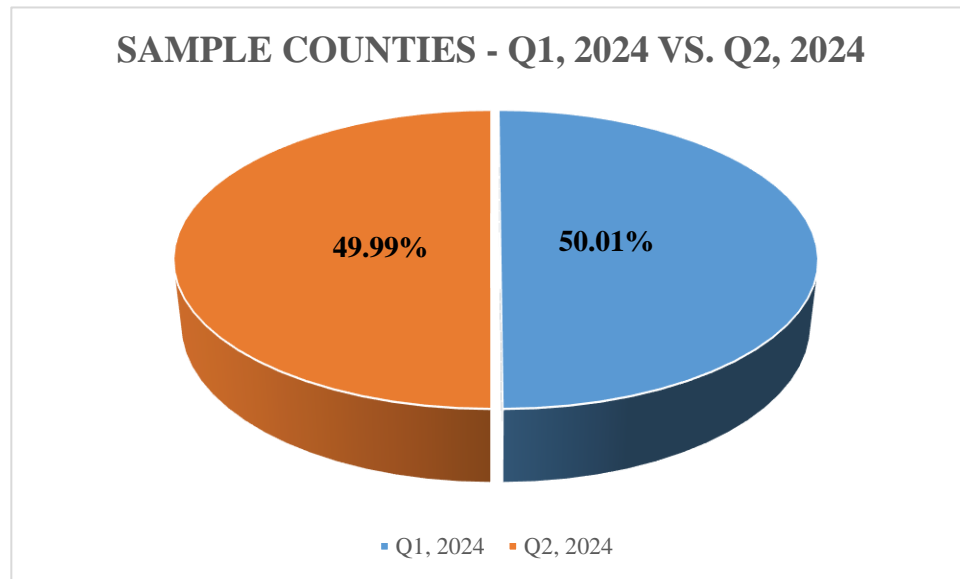

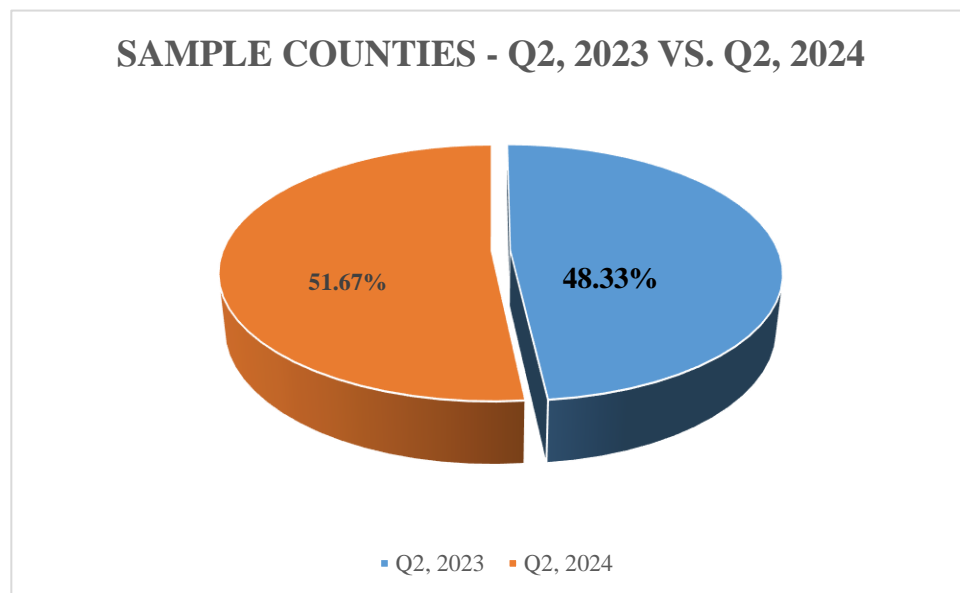

In the quarterly review for the four cities crime trend analysis, the crime statistics depicts an increase in criminal activities in the cities in the 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter of 2023 in comparison to the 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter of 2024. The crime data for the two periods stood at **4,798** and **5,527** criminal cases respectively representing a **15.19%** increase in crime rate in the two quarters.

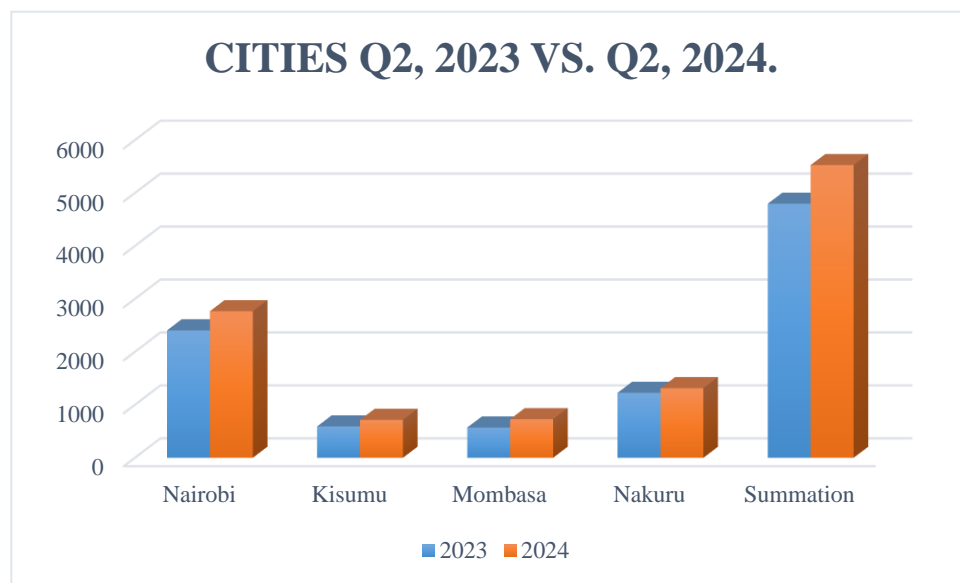
However, in a comparative crime trend analysis done for the 1<sup>st</sup> quarter of 2024 and the 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter of 2024 depicts a decline in crime trends between the two quarters. The crime data for Q1 of 2024 and Q2 of 2024 for

the cities category stood at **5,753** cases and **5,527** cases respectively representing a **3.93%** decline in crime rate in the two quarters.

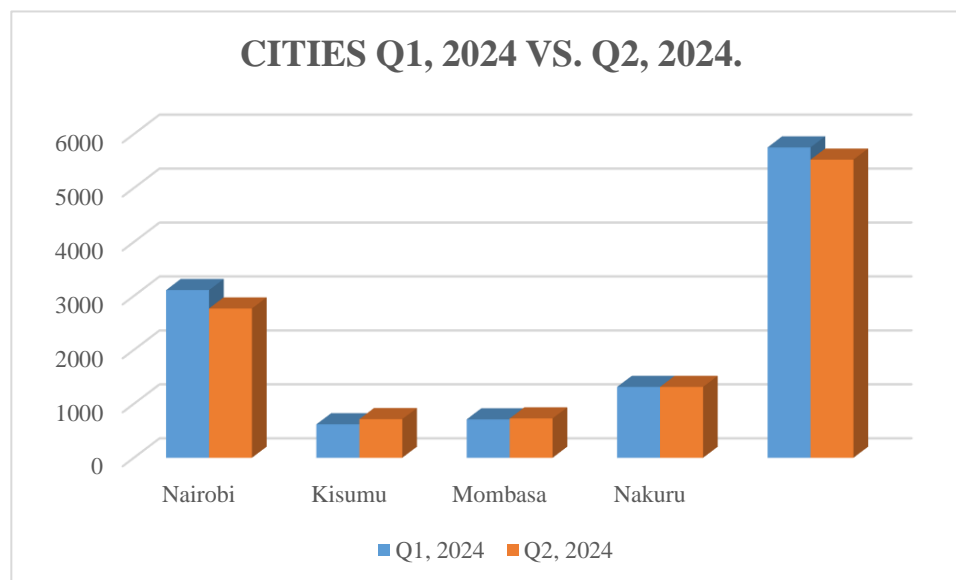
**Graphical Presentation of Data Q2 of 2023 & Q2 of 2024 Cities analysis:**

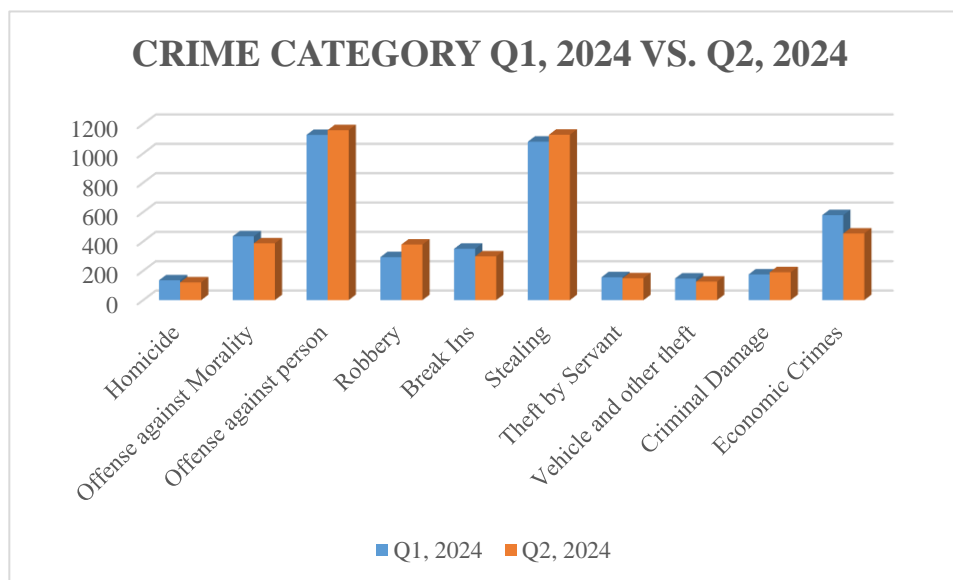
**Graphical Presentation of Data Q1 & Q2 of 2024 Cities analysis:**

**HALF YEAR OF 2024 CRIME TREND ANALYSIS:**

In the period to half year of 2024, a total of **24,415** criminal cases have been reported to the various law enforcement agencies within the sample counties.

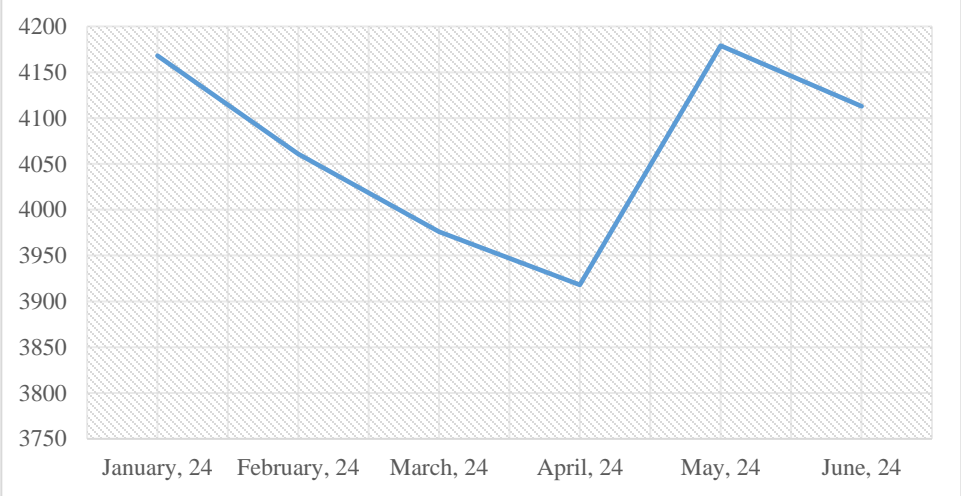
Out of the **24,415** criminal cases recorded in the half year of 2024, a sum of **11,280** cases were reported across the four cities in the Republic of Kenya. This accounts for **46.20%** of the total number of criminal cases recorded in the half year period.

Within the sample counties, crime was most prevalent in the month of May, 2024 whereby a total of **4,179** cases were recorded. The month of April, 2024 saw the least number of criminal activities being witnessed. A total of **3,918** cases were recorded.

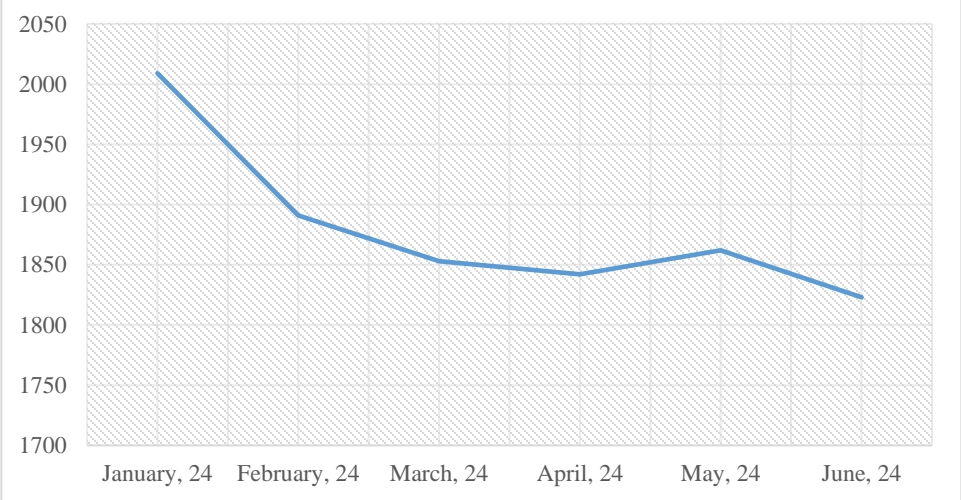
In the cities category, the crime trends over the first half of the year have witnessed a declining trend. This is the trend that has been witnessed in the Nairobi County as well.

Below are line graphs showing the half year crime trends under different areas of analysis.

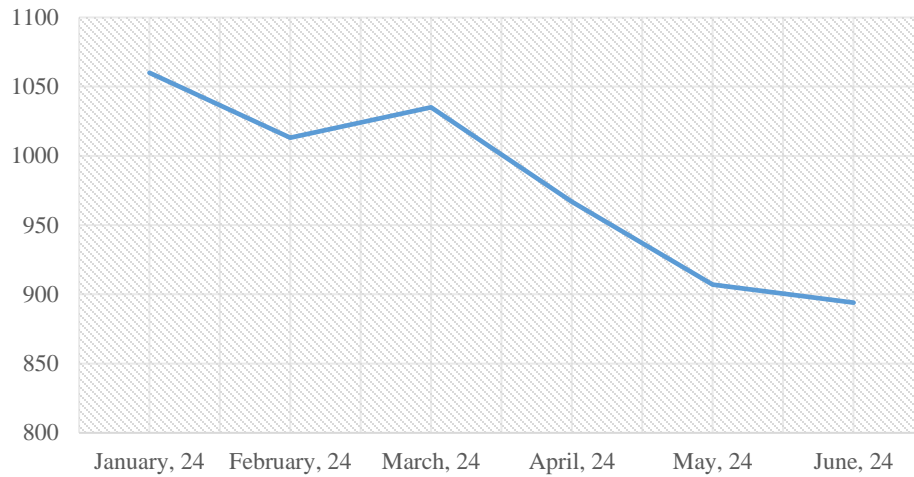
**Half Year, 2024 Trend - Sample Population.**



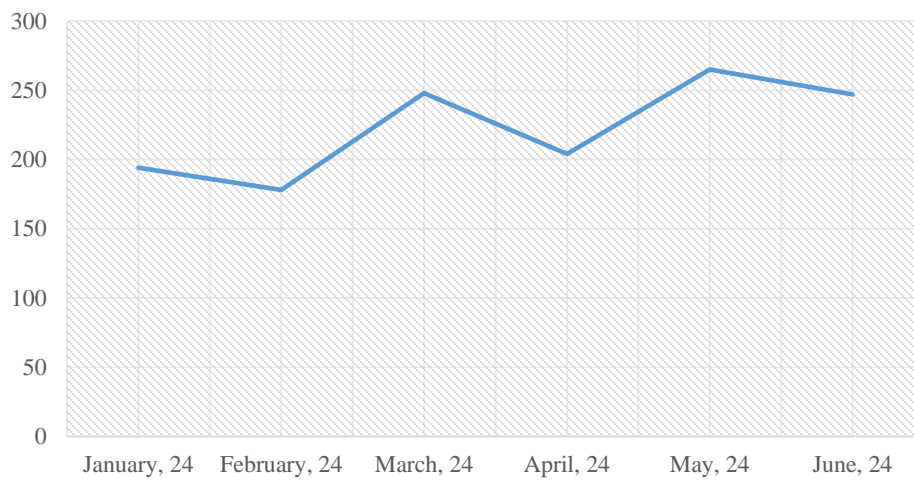
**CITIES - HALF YEAR 2024 CRIME TREND.**

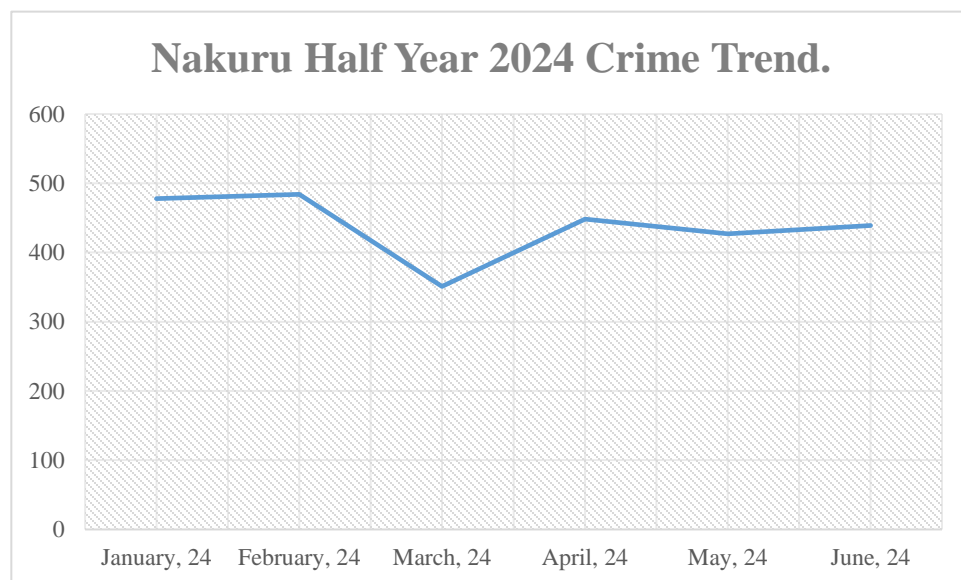
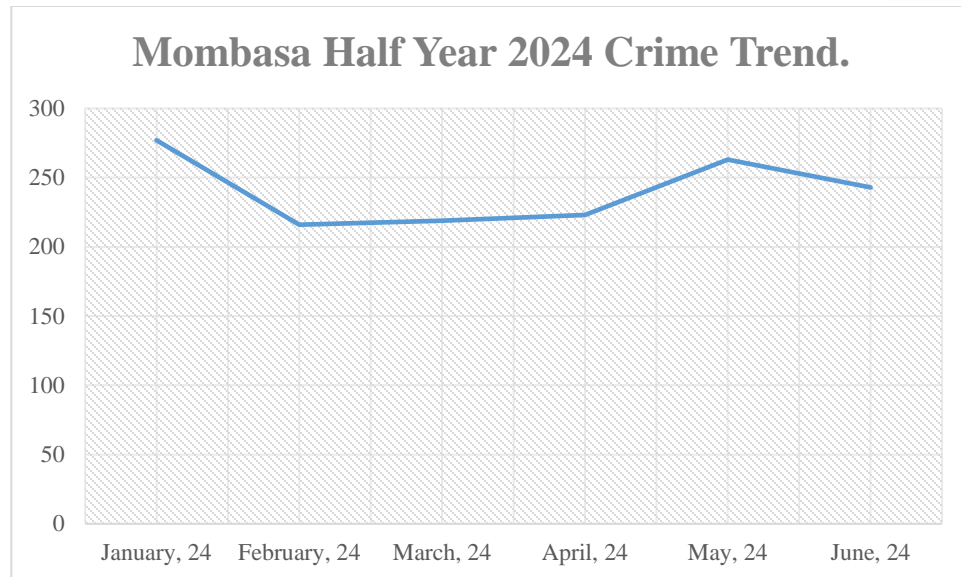


### Nairobi Half Year 2024 Crime Trend.
