CRIME REPORT (QUARTER 3, 2025 CRIME ANALYSIS.)







EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

Crime Analysis:

In the last three months, several criminal acts involving police officers have been reported. Some of the specific incidents that were reported include but not limited to:

Theft of police exhibits:

Eight police officers were arrested in Kisumu for allegedly stealing a vehicle that had been reported and booked in at the Maseno Police Station.

Abduction and robbery:

Three police officers in Kiambu County were arrested for allegedly abducting a businesswoman and robbing her of her valuables including hard cash.

Illegal arms and ammunition network:

Four police officers from the Prisons Service, National Police Service and the Central Firearms Stores were arrested for allegedly being part of a wider network that diverted government ammunition and firearms for sale to criminal networks.

Illegal possession and trafficking of firearms:

Six police officers were accused of illegally possessing and trafficking firearms and ammunitions in the Strifton area in the Northern Kenya. The arrests were made in connection with the alleged sale of ammunition in the Loki market.

In quarter 3 of 2025, a total of **11,552** criminal cases were recorded within the sample population. This is a **0.31%** drop in the total number of criminal cases recorded compared to the crime statistics for the quarter 2 of 2025 whereby a total of **11,588** criminal cases were recorded.

On the other hand, in the crime data obtained for the Nairobi, Kisumu, Nakuru and Mombasa cities over the same period, a **2.85%** rise in crime rate was witnessed in quarter 3 in comparison to quarter 2 of the year 2025. **5,256** criminal cases and **5,406** criminal cases were reported quarter 2 and 3 respectively.

The general crime trend in the cities over the past three quarters of the year have depicted an increasing trend in criminal cases. Over this period, crime was most prevalent in the months of June and August, 2025 whereby a total of **1,809** cases and **1,875** cases were recorded respectively.


The least number of criminal cases in the year 2025 to date were recorded in the month of February. A total of **1,637** cases were reported.

Graphical Presentation: Q1, 2 & 3 – Cities.



In the crime data under the cities for the quarter 3 of 2024, a total of **4,986** criminal cases were recorded in comparison to the **5,406** criminal cases that were recorded in the quarter 3 of 2025. This is an indication that there was an **8.42%** increase in crime rate in quarter 3 of 2025 in comparison to the quarter 3 of 2024.

On the other hand, under the general sample population, a **4.80%** increase in crime rate was witnessed in the quarter 3 of 2025 in comparison to the crime statistics of quarter 3 of 2024. **11,023** cases and **11,552** cases were reported in quarter 3 of 2024 and quarter 3 of 2025 respectively.





In the year 2025 year to the month of September, 2025 the total number of criminal cases that were recorded stood at **15,727** cases. This is a drop from **16,266** criminal cases that were recorded under a similar duration in the year 2024, which represents a **3.31%** drop under the period referred to above.



Graphical presentation: 2024 crime data to Q3 vs. 2025 crime data to Q3 – Cities.





Graphical presentation: 2024 crime data to Q3 vs. 2025 crime data to Q3 – Sample Population.




Graphical presentation: Crime trend through to Q3, 2025.









CRIME ANALYSIS PER CATEGORY:

In the analysis of crime under different categories, a very sharp rise in cases relating to theft of motor vehicles was witnessed in the quarter 3 of 2025 in comparison to the quarter 2 of 2025. A **41.38%** rise in these cases were reported within the cities of Nairobi, Kisumu, Nakuru and Mombasa. **87** cases were reported in quarter 2 while **123** cases were reported in quarter 3.

The other categories that witnessed in increase in the numbers recorded in quarter 3 in comparison to the crime figure in quarter 2 include: economic crime by **27.70%**, break ins by **9.05%**, and offenses against morality by **18.13%**.



Crimes under the category of theft by servant witnessed a significant reduction in Q3 in comparison to the Q2 crime data. The reduction was by **16.20%**.

Other crime categories that witnessed a reduction in the period under review are: criminal damage by **6.53%**, stealing by **10.06%**, robbery by **10.03%** offenses against persons by **2.01%** and homicide by **1.82%**.
